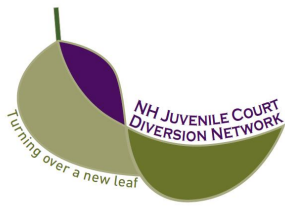

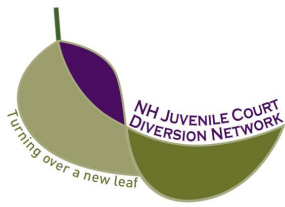

| PROGRAM AIM | <p>For 14 years, Belknap County Restorative Justice has been providing juvenile court diversion through a streamlined referral process from local police. The programs offered aim to: prevent juvenile delinquency, empower youth, help build stronger communities by bridging the gap between communities and at-risk youth and adults, repairing the harm done by crime, and ensuring offender accountability to their victims, family, and their community. The programs are cost-effective and emphasize accountability, education, decision-making skills and self-esteem development in a nonjudgmental atmosphere.</p> <p>The program aims to significantly increase the person's awareness of his/her inappropriate actions, while following the Restorative Justice Principal which encompasses: a balanced commitment to have concern for the victim, repair the harm imposed on the community, hold the offender accountable through community service, and build citizen skills and competencies in the offender. Participants must take responsibility for committing the offense with which they are charged to be eligible.</p> | | | | |

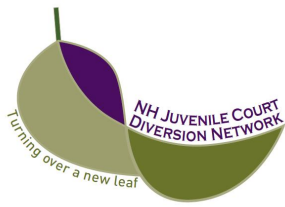

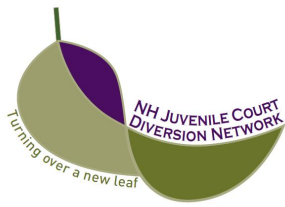

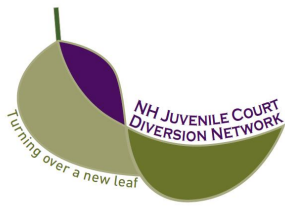

| PROGRAM AIM | <p>The Goffstown Area Juvenile Diversion Program (GDAP) was one of the first diversion programs established in the state and is proudly operated by Crispin's House Coalition for Youth, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization providing educational resources, positive role models and prevention programs for the families and youth of the greater Goffstown area. The GDAP is a community-based program offering first-time juvenile offenders an opportunity to be held accountable for their crime without going to court.</p> <p>To be accepted into the program, the offending youth must first admit their guilt. They will then be given a contract of specific consequences to complete that is designed to promote positive youth development while reducing juvenile crime and recidivism rates. Consequences may include but are not limited to performing community service, paying restitution, writing letters of apology, writing research papers, completing drug and alcohol education courses, performing in home drug testing under parental supervision, and attending counseling.</p> | | | | |

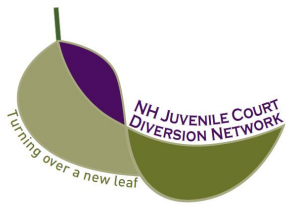

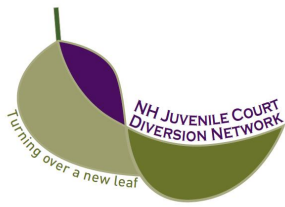

| PROGRAM AIM | <p>Grafton County Juvenile Restorative Justice focuses on youth that have committed minor offenses, helping make amends for the harm they caused to the victim, community, family and themselves while diverting first-time offenders from the traditional juvenile justice system. The program helps hold youth accountable while addressing at risk behavior with the goal of preventing future involvement with the criminal justice system. This model has been found to be highly beneficial to offenders, victims, families and community members alike. Common risk factors contributing to delinquency have been identified as substance abuse and mental health issues, poorly developed social and decision making skills, and complicated family issues. Restorative Justice programming seeks to address these factors by not only holding juveniles accountable for their behavior, but also identifying and treating individual needs. Additionally, Restorative Justice offers support to have a positive transition into adulthood by connecting youth to local resources they may need.</p> | | | | |
