| <b>PROGRAM AIM</b>                             | <p>CADY, Inc. works with schools and communities to prevent and reduce youth alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use. Desired outcomes for youth include the formation of healthy attitudes, empathy for victims, responsibility for personal actions, respect for self and others, and personal connections to the community that promotes a lasting change in behavior.</p> <p>Restorative Justice is a response to juvenile crime that emphasizes repairing the harm that was created by the offense. The restorative practice includes a panel process that promotes dialogue between the stakeholders to discuss consequences of the crime, harm to the victim, and to direct needed action by the offender. Instead of asking: "What law was broken?" or "Who broke the law?" Restorative Justice asks: "Who was harmed?" and "Who is responsible for repairing the harm?"</p> |  |  |  |  |       |
